Do You Want To Be Part of Something Big?

Small as a window box, large as a garden - do you have some land to spare? Grow Community - Sopwell launch the Jigsaw Meadow project in March 2024 when they will ask you to spare a piece of land; window box or patio planter, so together we create a Jigsaw or wildlife 'corridor' across Sopwell.

Wildlife corridors are vital for the survival of our natural neighbours. They bridge the gap between habitats which otherwise would be small and isolated and join them together, allowing movement between important habitats to support wildlife populations.

Have you got a metre of land for the Jigsaw Meadow? Think about what space you can spare for wildlife in your garden

and measure it (in cm). In February we will ask you to submit measurements so we can provide you with the right amount of seeds and knowledge to create a welcoming space for bees, butterflies, ladybirds and other amazing critters.

Last year Marshalswick Community Garden created a half-acre meadow with local residents. We have already had sponsorship from Aylett Nursery and other seed companies and Cottonmill Community & Cycling Centre have promised us a spot of land, but nature needs all the help it can get so we are aiming bigger!

Ask groups you know for some land for the Jigsaw Meadow. Can you ask any local businesses, schools, faith groups - anyone with any land - to see if they can join in by donating a spot of land, big or small. Over winter have a look outside and see if there is any space that might be spared.

News From the District Councillors

Fiscal pressures on the District Council continue to increase, which has resulted in unpalatable decisions to be taken, such as increasing the cost of parking permits, which was agreed to, very reluctantly, by all three of us. Until central government starts to fund local authorities across the UK, then all, including SADC, will have to raise revenue where we can, knowing that this will put pressure on residents. It hasn't been a decision taken lightly.

The RAAC guidance (concrete issues) was updated recently resulting in the Abbey View Pavilion being closed. Currently, there are no other affected buildings we are aware of.

The vandalism of the fence on the River Ver bank, close to the Cottonmill Open Space has resulted in the footpath being closed due to erosion of the riverbank and the narrowing of the path.

Annoyingly this now comes under the Environment Agency's remit (council requires an Environment Agency permit before work proceeds); this will take time to achieve.

The contractor appointed to build the King Offa went into receivership earlier this year. Consequently, the project has had to go out to tender again, and this is currently underway.

There have been reports of the Police driving along Alban Way, which we have raised with the Chief Constable and we understand is being 'dealt with'. Please let us know if you witness any further incidents of this nature.

NEWS on sale of St Albans Greenbelt Land for Warehouses

On 30th June this year, HertsCC announced the sale of 300 acres of South Herts greenbelt land to SEGRO plc.

SaveStAlbans Fight the Freight campaign lodged a Judicial Review on 29/9/2023 based on claims and evidence the land was bought under either Metropolitan Green Belt Act (1938) and /or Open Spaces Act (1906). HCC has not followed steps in the Acts to lawfully sell the land. If successful, the sale could be quashed, and development stopped. Success is emboldened by Supreme Court ruling March 23 (Day vs Shropshire): "Local Government cannot just dispose of land acquired as open space, parkland or recreational land for residents.."

Help build the case! Were you involved in meetings or have papers about, extraction of sand and gravel by Redland, from Radlett Airfield site (1980-2006), especially from a Park Street Village Hall meeting 21/2/1984? We already have Hertford archives and FoI requests, but do you have other records? Contact: communications@savestalbans.com
